ELEMENTARY COURSES

Kindergarten – 2nd Grades:

Exploring Art (K-2)

Teacher: Melissa Kaiser

Start your Veritas day with fun and creativity! Each week we will talk about a different artist and explore his or her style. Your child will try out different art techniques while learning more about the discipline. Kids will get to experiment with various media, such as paint, pastel, watercolor, and paper mosaic. Students will work on developing fine motor skills while encouraging their creative abilities. Melisa Kaiser has a degree in architecture, and teaches architecture to high school students. She has homeschooled her children for 11 years, and has taught art and design at camps and co-ops.

KinderKids

Teacher: Susie Smith

The KinderKids class explores a variety of themes/topics throughout the year. Some of the themes/topics we'll explore include the sun and moon, shapes, fire safety, seasons, health/nutrition, the states of matter, weather, Dr. Seuss, and recycling. Most themes will incorporate a letter of the day and basic math concepts – such as counting, sorting, patterns, graphing. We'll have messy science experiments, art/crafts, and other activities. In our class, we may use glue, paint, playdough, goldfish, cereal, shaving cream, baking soda, vinegar, cornstarch, or other food/baking products. Flat Stanley (K-2)

Come and join us as we learn about a boy who became flat, and could travel through the mail. We will read several chapters of the books aloud in class each week, and then complete a craft project that corresponds to the chapters we just read. Students are encouraged to have their own copy of the Flat Stanley books, so they can follow along, though it is not a requirement. Any reading level is welcome in this class, as independent reading is not required. My goal is to inspire your child to love literature, even at a very young age. As we complete each project, our books will come alive, and reading will become an adventure instead of a task. The Flat Stanley books are written by Jeff Brown. This will be the first semester of a year-long course in which children will learn art techniques, vocabulary, and elements of both art and design principles, while being introduced to Art Appreciation and History via works by masters. This first semester they'll gain a greater understanding of the art elements of space, line and shape, texture, value scale, form, contrast, shapes of natural forms, and edges, as well as elements of composition such as balance, rhythm, overlap, depth, proportion, the face, and movement.

Conversational Spanish (3-6)

This class is designed with elementary aged students in mind. Students will build on some basic grammar & vocabulary so as to begin some basic conversation skills. We will cover nouns, verbs, prepositions, how to conjugate regular verbs, and putting them in sentence form. We will also use well known stories, such as "The Three Little Bears" to accustom students to hearing Spanish in a familiar story, thus training their audio skills. Each week we will round off what we have learned with fun games to sharpen their skills. This class will be very useful to prepare students to be ready for more advanced Spanish language skills in the future. No textbook required. ***Note all the beginning & Spanish 1 classes will be working off of the same vocabulary lists. JR. HIGH COURSES

American History (7-8)

Teacher: Jeff Lemasters-Tahir

This is a year-long course that will cover the essentials of American History from the early explorers through the Cold War. We will emphasize learning the stories and the narratives that make the history come to life. By the end of the year, the students will gain an appreciation as to how the United States came to be, what has made it exceptional, and why it is, "the last best hope." I will be requesting that the students have "All American History--Uniting America's Story, Piece by Piece" by Celeste W. Rakes and published by Bright Ideas Press. We will use Volume 1 first semester and Volume 2 second semester. Students are only expected to have the Student Reader. We will also use "The Complete Middle School Study Guide--Everything You Need to Ace American History In One Big Fat Notebook." This book is available at Costco. ISBN #978-0-7611-6083-0. (A word of warning: This book does skew slightly to the left politically. I believe it is a great overview, regardless, and will attempt to teach in such a way as to eliminate the political bias). This book is not required, but highly recommended. I do require that every student have a copy of the U.S. Constitution and the Declaration of Independence. American Literature (7-9)

Teacher: Wendy Deckman

This course will explore many American classics and use literature as a starting point for our own writing. We will practice narrative, descriptive, expository, comparison, and creative writing. Grammar, vocabulary, spelling, reading comprehension, sentence construction, paragraph formation, and essay styles will be taught in detail. Students will be expected to read at least 30 minutes a day, five days a week, as well as maintain a prayer journal. Mrs. Deckman has a Master's degree in English, a secondary teaching credential, and has taught a variety of classes from 9th grade ESL in public high schools to graduate level research classes at universities. Honors American Literature (9-12)

Teacher: Michelle Phororo

This class emphasizes the development of reading, writing, and critical analysis by using a comprehensive study of literature, short stories, poems, speeches, and documents. Students will explore various styles of writing in preparation for the rigor of post-high school academics. This course also includes vocabulary study, instruction of the SAT essay standards, rhetorical analysis, and narrative techniques.

Short stories include authors such as O. Henry, Connell, and Poe.

Poems written by Longfellow, Roche, Whitman, Hughes, and Key will be examined and critiqued.

Speeches by Abraham Lincoln, Martin Luther King, Jr., and Ronald Reagan as well as documents such as 'The Mayflower Compact', 'The Monroe Doctrine', and 'Brown v. Board of Education' will be analyzed.
